## Basic details

**Author:** Abū al-Maʿālī Naṣr Allāh Munshī, secretary (*munshī*) at the Ghaznavid court during the reign of Bahrāmshāh (510–47/1117–52)

**Date of authorship:** ca. 538–40/1144–46 (as estimated by Mīnuvī)

**Manuscripts:** many extant; the earliest, dated 551/1156 (!), is MS 1727 in the Cârullah Efendi collection at the Süleymaniye Library, Istanbul; more easily accessible is Persian MS 68, dated 616/1219, at the John Rylands Library, University of Manchester
